

Judging Criteria Project - Junior

Introduction:

As part of the requirements for team participation in the upcoming English Language Olympia, each team is expected to select a “problem” or a “challenge” from within its residence area, local community, or country. Each team presents an idea of a project (a new idea/creative solution) related to the ELO theme of the year. Each team will then have (5) minutes to display their project in front of a group of judges. Each team should work on fund raising for \$25 whether cash or in kind contribution.

Conditions & Limitations:

Competing teams should consider the following:

Criteria	Description			
Language	English should be the main language used in presenting the work conducted.			
Participation	It is important for all team members to equally participate in achieving the goals of each ELO topic. Each of the team members should have a significant role when presenting their work as well.			
Attendance	Students	All team members have to attend, as absence will result in a lower score.		
	Coaches	Can attend, but they are not allowed to give any guidance.		
Duration	Presenting	should not exceed (5) minutes		
	Discussion	should not exceed (2) minutes		
Idea	The idea of the Project should be related to the main theme of the ELO.

How to present	Teams should save any multimedia files (video, sound, photos) needed for the presentation on an external device (flash drive or hard disk) to be connected to the presentation computer.			
What to present	Each team is expected to select a “problem/creative idea/solution” from within their local community, and come up with a practical solution.			
Criteria	The appraisal criteria below should be taken into consideration while working on the Project.			
Responsibility	Teams are responsible for their equipment workability (i.e. flash memory, etc.) when they use it to present their work			
Sponsorship	The team should show how the sponsorship amount was obtained and used for the Project or the Community Service activity.			





Score Breakdown: Project

Score Elements	Points
Project	29%
English Language Proficiency	4%

- **Innovative Solution:** the judging panel will score the “Innovative Solution” that the team has come up with in 5 ways:

1. **Team Solution:** teams will receive higher scores if their solutions are easy to understand, original, and reflect good teamwork.

2. **Innovation:** scores will be given based on the degree to which a team’s solution contributes to a better life by improving existing options, developing a new application of existing ideas, or solving a problem in a completely new way. Higher scores will be granted if teams come up with original solutions that have a potential to add significant value.

3. **Applicability:** solutions should be practical application from a real-life perspective will receive higher scores.

- **Fund Raising:** score will be granted to teams who are able to source funding to their projects of at least \$25 whether (cash or in kind contribution), and make efficient use of the fund.

- **Presentation:** the Judging panel will score presentations that each team has come up with in 2 ways:

1. **ICT Integration:** high scores will be given to highly engaging and exceptionally imaginative presentations that show creative integration of ICT in the presentation development and delivery.

2. **Sharing & Effectiveness:** scores will be given on how the Project roles are shared among team members. In addition to how clear and well organized the presentation is.

- **English Language Proficiency:** the correct use of English language will be evaluated according to criteria for interactive communication, oral production, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation.
