

Judging Criteria Teamwork

Introduction:

As part of the requirements for team participation in the upcoming English Language Olympia (ELO), Teamwork performance will be evaluated while team members present their work on the ELO topics (Project, Community Service, Theatrical Performance). Judges will fill out a designated form to measure the teams' communication, cooperation, and the steps followed to complete their work according to predetermined standards.

Competing teams should consider the following:

Criteria	The teamwork appraisal criteria below (Score Breakdown) should be taken into consideration while working as a team.					
Responsibility	Teams are responsible for their equipment workability (i.e. laptop, flash memory, etc.) when they use it to present their work.

Competing teams have to pay attention to the following areas while working together:

- Team Spirit: the judging panel will assess how each of the participating teams has worked as a team toward achieving the assigned task. The following elements are important in reflecting a healthy team spirit:
- 1. One-Team Spirit: students should show that the assigned project/work is theirs and that they all work for the same goal.
- 2. Diversity & Acceptance: diversity within the team in roles or characters is very important. Students have to respect each other and accept differences amongst themselves. They should not allow their differences to prevent them from working together.
- 3. Working with Others: team members should have a positive attitude and good listening skills. They should also share and support the efforts of other members of their team.
- Team Management: the ability of competing teams to manage their work properly and overcome challenges they face throughout their preparation, as follows:
- 1. Division of Work: work load should be divided among all team members equally or in a balanced way.
- 2. Management of Work: work tasks should be assigned to individual team members based on their talent or skills.
- 3. Problem Solving: students should actively suggest solutions to problems and be able to overcome challenges.
- Interpersonal Skills: the following interpersonal skills are crucial for successful teamwork:
- 1. Listening Skills: students listen attentively and consider the ideas of others.
- 2. Communication: students communicate clearly and regularly throughout the process of their preparations.
- Collage: a collage project will be assigned for a period of one hour on the day of the ELO event. Teams will be provided with the necessary materials to work on their collage activity.
- English Language Proficiency: the correct use of English language will be evaluated according to criteria for interactive communication, oral production, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation.
